

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Citizens' Budget

Budget:

A budget is an estimate of income and expenditure over a specific period.

Government Budget:

A government budget is a document presenting the estimated income from taxes and other sources and the estimated spending of government over a specific financial year. In Pakistan the financial year spans between July and June.

Citizens' Budget:

Citizens' Budget are designed to present key public finance information to a general audience. They are typically written in accessible language and incorporate visual elements to help non-specialist readers understand the information.


Issuance of citizens' budget is a rare practice in Pakistan; only very recently have the two provincial governments produced such document. No district governments has ever issued any citizens' budget at all. This citizens' budget is the first such document produced in Pakistan at district level.




